target for maximum total time spent waiting for a and e services as well as with the wider modernisation of emergency care the report's conclusions include that given the high level of demand there has been a significant and sustained progress towards reducing waiting times in a and e departments and improving the patient's experience largely due to improved working practices and increased local investment however there is further room for improvement in the case of patients with more complex needs such as older people and those with mental health needs and regional variations still exist with the performance of the worst performing trusts still some way behind further major improvements will depend on tackling the remaining bottlenecks and barriers to modernisation within wider emergency care services the establishment of local emergency care networks is highlighted as a promising development as a means to secure greater emergency care service integration and joint working
